## WELCOME TO THE OKLAHOMA CORNHOLE ASSOCIATION

### *SOAR HIGH WITH THE EAGLES OKLAHOMA PLAYERS! SEASON 22-23*

Welcome to Oklahoma Cornhole Association (OCA), the state's largest points system for players in Oklahoma and surrounding states. Once you become an OCA member, you will accumulate points and standings in Oklahoma. The season will begin October and run through August ending with the state championship the summer of 2023. All events and points will be completed before the championship.

#### **OCA REGIONS/ CLUBS**

SOCA, SOB, MOB, BWC-FBI, BDB, TS, H2O, TCBaggers, NWOCA, H-TOWN, OSCC, K-Town Baggers, 81 Baggers, Seminole Cornhole, Beckham County Baggers

#### **OCA SEASONS (located in Scoreholio App)**

- All points will be contained in Scoreholio "OCA Seasons." There are 5 divisions offered at each tournament: Advanced, competitive, intermediate, recreational, youth (12 under with ppr under 5.3).

#### **How to Register**

1. Download Scoreholio App on your smart device
2. Create an account
3. Edit Profile so the Display name is first and last name
4. Click on event link to register.

#### **How to Become a Member**

1. Download Scoreholio App on your smart device
2. Create an account
3. Edit Profile so the Display name is first and last name
4. Attend your regional director's tournament
5. Ask to pay your membership of \$30
6. Regional Director will scan your profile check in QR Code
7. Boom! You are a member.

\*Every month memberships will stop on Sunday before a regional or major and resume after the tournament is over. You can buy membership at the OCA event.

Players who do not pre-register for Regionals and Majors by the deadline will incur a late fee. OCA will call for all pre-registered players to check in first. Then we will scan all the late registrations.

SCOREHOLIO RULES- YOU MUST CHANGE YOUR "DISPLAY NAME" IN YOUR SCOREHOLIO PROFILE TO YOUR FIRST AND LAST NAME BEFORE ENTERING A TOURNAMENT. VERY IMPORTANT!!!!

## OCA REGIONALS

---

### DIVISIONS-

- Youth
- Recreational
- Intermediate
- Competitive
- Advanced

### MEMBERSHIP REQUIRED

Only OCA members can participate in OCA REGIONAL events.

### REGIONAL FORMAT- SINGLES / DOUBLES

- Divisional Rounders + Tier 1 (A) Tier 2(B) Double Elimination Tournament with minimum number of teams/players met.
- **Players are locked in for the weekend. We do NOT bump at Regionals on-the-spot because it causes the player's teammate to find another partner or play up last minute. We feel like this is unfair practice.**
- However, players may be bumped between one tournament to the next based on PPR, Regional Director, and Rules and Regulations Committee.

## OCA MAJORS

---

### DIVISIONS-

- Youth
- Recreational
- Intermediate
- Competitive
- Advanced
- Oklahoma's Best

### MEMBERSHIP REQUIRED

Only OCA members can participate in OCA MAJOR events.

### MAJOR FORMAT- SINGLES / DOUBLES

- Seeded Double Elimination Tournaments + Single Elimination Dropdown Tournament for players/teams with 0-2 record (must have 30 player/team minimum) (depends on timing and board availability)
- Singles- Best 2/3 in winner's and 1 in the loser's
- Doubles- Best 2/3 in winner's and 1 in the loser's

## DOUBLE POINTS

- Players are locked in for the weekend. We do NOT bump at majors on-the-spot because it causes the player's teammate to find another partner or play up last minute. We feel like this is unfair practice.
- However, players may be bumped between one tournament to the next based on PPR, Regional Director, and Rules and Regulations Committee.
- Oklahoma's Best are invitational only. Directors choose who will play in the tournament.

---

## OCA LOCALS

---

- 8 Singles and 8 Doubles will be on the OCA Scorecard.
- Players may participate **any** local OCA tournaments across the state.
- Players may play in **unlimited** local tournaments. The top 8 singles and doubles results will go into the scorecard.
- Non-OCA members may play in locals but will **NOT receive points**.
- 70% or higher payout
- 6 Player/Team Minimum

---

## OCA LEAGUE

---

- 2 OCA Leagues will be offered. Only the highest result of the two will show in the scorecard.
- Leagues run 3 weeks **or more** + playoffs.
- 6 Team minimum. If there aren't at least 6 teams, a director may merge to a higher division.
- Non-OCA members may participate in league but will not receive points.
- Directors may decide rules and type of league.
- Non-OCA members are eligible to play in league and championship playoffs but will NOT receive points.
- OCA League points will be given to teams who win the playoffs. Original paid players may be in playoffs.

\*Oklahoma Cup and State are NOT a part of cumulative points and standings. However, OCA will use the points and standings for seeding and state requirements.

Cost is ½ if only playing in one event instead of both. **Late Fee- Regionals \$5 / Majors \$10**

\*DOUBLES RULE- TEAMS MUST PLAY UP IN THE HIGHEST DIVISION OF THE TWO PLAYERS.  
EXAMPLE: IF ONE PLAYER IS RANKED COMPETITIVE (ELIGIBLE PPR COMPETITIVE) AND THE OTHER PLAYER IS RANKED ADVANCED (ELIGIBLE PPR ADVANCED), THE TEAM CAN ONLY PLAY ADVANCED.

## MEMBERSHIPS

---

- OCA Memberships for Oklahoma residents cost \$30.
- Must be a member of OCA to participate in OCA REGIONALS, MAJORS, CUP, AND STATE events.
- Exception- Youth 12 & under will not pay membership fees **if playing in the youth division only** and not the adult divisions at regionals, majors, league or locals.
- Out-of-state players may purchase an OCA membership for \$40 and must follow all requirements regarding ppr, new profiles, etc.
- Any OCA member who participates in **at least 33%** of OCA events for the season may play in the **Oklahoma State Championship tournament** at the end of the season. Any player who is a resident of Oklahoma and **does not have a membership may purchase a membership for \$40 at state** and **can only play in Advanced** unless a director gives special approval for a lower division. (This rule **does not apply to "Family Event"** offered at state.
- Out-of-state players who purchase a membership and participate in **at least 50%** of OCA events for the season may play in the Oklahoma State Championship Tournament at the end of the season.
- A membership entitles the player to points for the "OCA Season 22-23" beginning the day the membership is purchased at a regional or major or from a director.
- **NO MEMBERSHIP MONEY MAY BE GIVEN TO A REGIONAL DIRECTOR A WEEK BEFORE A REGIONAL OR MAJOR. WAIT AND PAY FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AT THE TOURNAMENT.**
- Everyone must be a member to play at OCA Regionals and Majors.
- Players can buy memberships from their regional director. Each director will have a Membership Tournament in Scoreholio with list of all paid members.

## PAYOUT SCALE

---

Advanced (A) 80%

Competitive (C) 70%

Intermediate (I) 60%

Recreational (R) 50%

League 50% or higher if running 4 divisions (example rec 50%, inter.60%, comp.70% advanced 80%. Director will choose payout but it cannot be lower than 50%.

Local 70% or higher

Youth ages 5-12 (Y) 100%

\*Regional/Local Directors may also give prizes **in addition** to cash payouts such as medals, trophies, t-shirts, patches, & donations to money pot. (Trophies must have OCA logo on them.)

## YOUTH DIVISION

---

YOUTH RULE- If a youth player turns 13 in the middle of the season, he/she may finish the season if only playing in the youth division.

YOUTH BOARDS ARE SET AT 23FT.

YOUTH DIVISION WILL EARN RECREATIONAL B BRACKET POINTS.  
PPR LIMIT OF NO HIGHER THAN 5.3

## BUMPS

---

- **AUTO BUMP**- A player that places “in the money” **3 TIMES** in a season at a regional or major IN THE A BRACKET will be auto-bumped. This may be singles or doubles or any combination of both. (THE BUMP WILL TRUMP THE PPR RANGE SET IN OCA.)
- ONCE THE PLAYER MOVES UP, THEY MUST PLAY IN AT LEAST 2 MORE TOURNAMENTS AND FINISH 0-2 BEFORE A PETITION TO DROP CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS COMMITTEE AND DIRECTORS.
- **SELF BUMP**- AT TIMES OCA RECOGNIZES PLAYERS WHO ARE HIGHLY SKILLED IN THEIR CURRENT DIVISION. WE MAY REACH OUT TO DISCUSS A SELF BUMP. OCA WORKS HARD TO GET ALL PLAYERS WHERE THEY NEED TO BE. THE PLAYER DOES NOT HAVE TO ACCEPT A SELF BUMP. ONCE THE PLAYER MOVES UP, THEY MUST PLAY IN AT LEAST 2 MORE TOURNAMENTS AND FINISH 0-2 BEFORE A PETITION TO DROP CAN BE SUBMITTED TO RULES AND REGULATIONS COMMITTEE AND DIRECTORS.
- **PETITION TO DROP**- must be submitted and approved one month prior to a regional or major. OCA TEAM AND RULES AND REG COMMITTEE WILL NEED TO BE INFORMED AND APPROVE.

## RULES AND REGULATION COMMITTEE

---

OCA Rules and Regulations Committee and Director/ Co-Director will monitor all players on their club’s roster. RR Committee will be looking for:

- re-created profiles (NEW) profiles in Scoreholio as well as players ppr ranges.
- Drastic swings in SPR drops etc.
- Movement of PPR ranges
- Bumps-

*Sandbagging kills the spirit of new throwers who might have otherwise loved the game. We stand to lose players in the lower divisions if sandbagging occurs. We will always encourage self-bumps to players who are outplaying their competition consistently. PPR ranges should help the sandbagging situation. OCA will use the 120-day average ppr range with 75% of games within the last 30 days tracked. Otherwise, the player will need to play at or above the OCA ranking or at level the regional director approves.*

## SCOREMAGIC

---

Scoremagic is 100% required at ALL OCA events. <https://scoreholio.com/scoremagic/>  
An average PPR must meet the following criteria: 75% of games must be bag tracked within the last 30 days for OCA to use PPR. Otherwise the player will play up in the next highest division or play at current OCA ranking.

## PPR RANGES

---

\*Disclaimer- OCA reserves the right to adjust (PPR) ranges after season has begun using data from regionals and majors.

- PPR RANGES WILL DETERMINE THE DIVISION THE PLAYER IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE AT EACH REGIONAL AND MAJOR ONCE THE PLAYER HAS 75% OF GAMES WITHIN THE LAST 30 DAYS TRACKED. \*OCA USES THE 120 DAY AVERAGE PPR RANGE.
- PLAYERS WHO DO NOT MEET THE PPR REQUIREMENTS WILL PLAY IN THE DIVISION OCA HAS SET FOR THE PLAYER.

## PLAYER SKILL LEVEL

---

OCA uses a 120 average (PPR) range. 75% of games within the last 30 days must be tracked using Scoremagic.

Advanced (A)- This player will compete against anyone. The player can execute a slide bag, block bag, flop, roll, cut, and airmail when called for in a game. The player will step out using the entire box to throw around a block bag. The player understands game strategy and likely plays and practices on a regular basis. The player averages 8.0 (PPR- UP).

Competitive (C)- The player can execute a slide bag, block bag, and airmail but may struggle with consistency. The player understands the strategy of the game. The player may dominate another player one game and then struggle in the next. The player is concerned with playing competitors that are better than them in order to increase their skill. The player seeks every opportunity to play and advance their game. The “C” players may be divided into a “high C+” category and “low C” category. The high C+ player may try to play at an advanced level to try and increase their skill. The low C player should play in competitive events. The player averages 6.51-7.99 (PPR).

Intermediate (I)- The player attempts a slide bag, block bag, and airmail but cannot completely use the skill when needed in a challenge or game. The player may be consistent using 1 or 2 of

the skills but not all 3. The player is starting to develop some consistency will skills such as the block, slide, and airmail. The player has a basic understanding of game strategy but has not mastered the different skills. The “I” players may be divided into a “high I+” category and “low I” category. The high I+ player may try to play at a competitive level to try and increase their skill. The low I player should play in intermediate events. The player averages 5.31-6.50 (PPR).

**Recreational (R)** - The player can make all 4 bags on the board or occasionally throw 1 bag in the hole. The player will at times throw a bag or two off the board with a lot of inconsistency. The player struggles to use skills and is mostly trying to get the bags on the board. The “R” players may be divided into a “high R+” category and “low R” category. The high R+ player may try to play at a intermediate level to try and increase their skill. The player averages 5.3 & below (PPR).

---

## BAG POLICY

---

*PLAYERS MAY PLAY WITH REGULATION BAGS THAT WEIGH 15.5 OZ-16.25. PLAYERS WHO THROW WITH MANIPULATED BAGS SUCH AS ADDING ANY KIND OF GREASE OR ADDED FOREIGN SUBSTANCE FOR ENHANCEMENT OF PLAY WILL FORFEIT THE TOURNAMENT. HOMEMADE BAGS AND CORN BAGS ARE NOT ALLOWED. PLAYER HAS THE RIGHT TO INSPECT THE OPPONENT'S BAGS BEFORE MATCH HAS BEGUN. ALL BAG CHALLENGES MUST BE MADE BEFORE THE GAME BEGINS AND FIRST BAG IS THROWN. PLAYERS WITH MODIFIED BAGS RISK LOSING PRIZE MONEY PAYOUTS. BAGS THAT GET WET MAY BE SWITCHED OUT FOR AN ENTIRE NEW SET OF BAGS IF BOTH TEAMS/PLAYERS AGREE.*

## GAME RULES

---

<b>Coin Flip/ Bag spin on board. Seam decides. -Singles-</b> the winner gets to throw first or choose a side.
---

<b>Coin Flip/ Bag spin on board. Seam decides. -Doubles-</b> the winners get first bags and sides or match up.
--

In all two out of three matches, the team who wins the coin flip will choose sides and first bags or match up. The second game, the team that loses the coin flip will get sides and first bags or match up. Match up means the winners of the coin flip choose the players they want to throw bags against. The other team will get sides and first bags if this option is taken.
--

In singles games, the player who wins the coin flip will choose sides or first bags.
--

Cancellation ruling- points cancel, no bust rules.
--

Singles Events are one game in the winners and one game in the losers (cancellation ruling).
--



In the case of emergency time issues and the venue is going to close, the tournament director may either change the format to place time limits on games and matches and also switch the format to race to 15 (all points count) or continue with cancellation ruling but first team to 15 wins to speed up timing or move to the following day.
If a player throws out of turn, the bag is removed, and no points are counted. The opponent will throw 2 bags in a row.
Bracket finals- Best of 1 Format- if the team/ player from the loser's side wins the first game it forces another best of 1 with a new coin flip. If the team/player from the winning side wins the first game in the winner's final; the final is over, and the team/player wins the tournament.
If a foul bag has caused other bags to be moved or pushed in the hole, the foul bag will not count, and the bags will be moved to the original spot.
If a player cannot finish the game, the opponent gets an automatic win and the player forfeits. Player will get the rest of points to 21 for the win.
Time outs-During a singles game, each player is allowed two 90 sec. time outs. In a doubles game, each team is allowed one 90 sec. time out. Any bags still in play, must be left on board and both players may walk to look at the board and bags or discuss strategy. At no point may the bags be touched or picked up during the timeout. If any bags are moved or touched and the offending team or person who touches the bags, forfeits all remaining bags left in hands. The non-offending team tallies an automatic 12 points no matter what is showing on the board to be cancelled out against the opponent's points. To be clear, the 12 is cancelled by any points the opponent has on the board.
Bag Sweep-Bags that are stacked under the hole may cause a bag to sit or hang inside the hole on top of the bags. A sweep by the director or another player may occur without disturbing or touching the hanging bag. If the bag does not fall after the sweep, the bag counts as 1 point. If it falls, the bag counts as 3 points.
After a round is thrown, typically the bags are touched 3 seconds after. If a bag is about to fall in the hole, the players will wait 3 seconds and then grab bags and count points.
Step-out-When pitching a bag, a player must have at least part of one foot inside the pitcher's box and not cross the foul line.
*Any bag removed from the board or touched before scoring has been agreed, the offending team who touches the bags forfeits all remaining bags left in hands are dead bags worth no points and tallies the score of just the bags thrown before the foul was reported. The non-offending team tallies an automatic 12 points no matter what is showing on the board to be cancelled out against the opponent's points.
Foul:
Bag that hits the ground first does not count. If a bag is hanging off the board and is touching the ground, the bag does not count toward points.
A player that steps over the foul line before the bag is pitched is a toe foul. The bag cannot be counted as points. Make sure the toes are not crossing the front of the

boards **before the bag is pitched**. Points are added in favor of the opponent and no points are awarded to the offender. The bag is removed from board.

A step after the bag is thrown is highly controversial. It is not a foul if the step is after the bag is pitched. The player will remain in his or her lane and will not step over into the opponent's lane. A warning is typically given before the rule becomes enforced as a courtesy to the player. If the issue is not fixed after the warning, the player will forfeit points made from the pitched bag and the opponent will earn points resulting in the bag thrown. Offending player's bag will be removed with no points scored for that round.

A player must stay inside the pitcher's box to throw a bag or have one foot inside. The player must deliver bag within a 20 second time limit.

---

## PROFILES IN SCOREHOLIO/ RULES/ PROCEDURES

---

### DO NOT RECREATE PROFILES

- PLAYERS MUST USE THE SCOREHOLIO "LIVE CHAT" AND WORK DIRECTLY WITH THEM TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM. I
- IF THERE ARE NO OTHER OPTIONS AND "LIVE CHAT" DID NOT WORK, REACH OUT TO JAMES BRANTLEY.
- James Brantley and Regional Directors may approve a new profile.

*THERE ARE HARSH PENALTIES ATTACHED TO THE BREAKING OF THIS PROCEDURE.*

## RULES FOR RECREATING PROFILES WITHOUT FOLLOWING THE PROCEDURE

---

If caught with a recreated profile without prior approval and player did not follow the procedure, the player will forfeit for the rest of singles with **no refund**.

The player can still play in doubles but in the **next highest division** with his/her partner.

---

## RULES FOR MANIPULATING YOUR PPR

---

Tampering with accounts or manipulating the system if caught during the tournament will result in forfeit immediately if in singles. The player will be required to play in the next highest division until the 120 average PPR with 75% of games within the last 30 days is met.

If caught during doubles, the doubles team will forfeit the remainder of the tournament with a refund to the player's partner only. The player will be required to play in the next highest division until the 120 average PPR with 75% of games within the last 30 days is met.

---

## OKLAHOMA CORNHOLE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP VII

---

- **Residents of the State of Oklahoma**, who are members of OCA, and have participated in at **least 33%** of OCA seasonal tournaments may play in the state championship.
- **Out-of-state OCA members** who have participated in at **least 50%** of OCA seasonal tournaments may play in the state championship.
- New players who are **not members of OCA may purchase a membership** at STATE but **must play in advanced** only unless given permission to play in a lower division by the regional director and rules and regulation committee. Exception- "family event" "youth event" and any other novice player tournament offered at state.
- Oklahoma Player may not play with an out-of-state player at state unless they are a member of OCA, have played in 50% or more of OCA events.
- Calcutta silent auction will be offered at state with possibility of live auction if time permits.
- Oklahoma's Best Single Elimination
- Trophies Galore!
- Top 30 jerseys are white with player's number. Other players may buy an Oklahoma Cornhole Association jersey with the same design but without the number and a different color.
- State Swag

### SEASON RECOGNITIONS AT STATE

- Top 30 players will earn the right to buy a specialty jersey.
- Two players of the year will go to the top female and male with the highest points in OCA and receive BIG HEADS prop.
- The top 2 finishers in each division will be eligible for ALL STAR trophies
- Regional directors will choose 2 Rising Stars to earn STATE trophies
- Oklahoma's Best Winner will get a banner and big head to be displayed at STATE
- Player's will be boosted to **GOLD VIP** status for filling up their scorecard participating in 3 majors and 4 regionals, **plus 16 locals (8 singles 8 doubles) and 1 league. (Full scorecard)**
- Only these players will be offered state perks.
- The regional directors will earn state perks and recognition.

- Regional Director’s will get a free membership and will not pay door fees at Majors and Regionals.
- Oklahoma’s Best Winner will get name on perpetual plaque to be displayed at OCA events.
- OCA will decide on a TOP 30 RAFFLE for just the top players in OCA.

## OKLAHOMA’S BEST INVITATIONAL

- Oklahoma’s Best is a friendly competition for regional bragging rights.
- Each host regional director will choose an OCA player (must be a member) in their region (not to be voted on by players but chosen by the regional directors) to play at each OCA Major Event.
- The players will play in a single elimination pre-qualifier tournament at the Major.
- The winner becomes a semi-finalist at the State Championship.
- Once a player has played in an Oklahoma’s Best, the same player may NOT be allowed to play again in another Oklahoma’s Best at another Major.
- Each semi-finalist will play in a championship single elimination tournament at State alongside all top 30 players.
- If any players win the qualifiers and are in the top 30, OCA will take the next player past top 30. The winner of OK’s Best will receive a trophy, name on a perpetual plaque, and be crowned OKLAHOMA’S BEST!

- Player will not disrupt another player’s pitch with obvious intent. Results in a forfeit of game.
- Player may not interfere with an opponent’s bag during the flight path. Results the rest of the player’s bags are forfeited for the remainder of the round. The player gets to re-pitch the bag.

- Yelling or movements that are distracting to the opposing team is not permitted. Warning will be issued. The player is disqualified for the rest of the tournament if the behavior continues to disrupt the game.
- Coaching on the sidelines is not permitted.
- Spectators may not give strategic advice.
- In doubles, the partner is the only one that may coach the partner.

**SOCIAL MEDIA OCA RULE-** derogatory comments, pictures, distorted information, etc. of OCA owners, regional directors, players, OCA families will result in the following:

Warning to remove comment, post, picture, thread etc. immediately.

- If not taken down immediately, suspension for 2 upcoming regional or major events and block on OCA social media pages, groups etc.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Time Social Media bashing of OCA owners, regional directors, players, OCA families... suspension for **half** the season.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Time "" suspension for **entire** season.

*The owners and/or the OCA regional directors group reserves the right to deem any behavior inappropriate if it harms the integrity of the game or the reputation of their region or OCA business either at a tournament or on social media. The player may have to forfeit the game, be disqualified from a tournament, be placed on suspension, or banned from OCA for the entire season.
